## **GUIDE FOR AUTHORS**

#### **Preparing Your Article**

Please keep in mind that your article should be a scientific journal paper in nature. It should be based on your project outcomes but should not be just a summary of how your project was implemented. In addition, it should not duplicate any content that has been published elsewhere.

Please use the supplied template and keep custom layout and formatting to a minimum. All manuscripts must contain the essential elements needed to convey your manuscript, for example

abstract, keywords, introduction, methods, results, conclusions, as well as artwork and tables with captions. See the "Article Structure" section below for details.

#### Word Limit

Prepare your text in British English and try to limit the length of your article to between 3000 and 5000 words (including references).

#### **Article Structure**

Divide your article into clearly defined and numbered sections. Subsections should be numbered 1.1 (then 1.1.1, 1.1.2, ...), 1.2, etc. (the abstract is not included in section numbering). Use this numbering also for internal cross-referencing: do not just refer to 'the text'. Any subsection may be given a brief heading. Each heading should appear on its own separate line.

Please structure your main content in "IMRAD" format (Introduction, Methods, Results, and Discussion) as indicated in the template provided.

#### Title

Provide a concise and informative noting that the title will be used in the APN E-Lib metadata portal. Avoid abbreviations or formulae in titles.

#### Authors

Please clearly indicate the given name(s) and family name(s) of each author and check that all names are accurately spelt. Present the authors' affiliation addresses below the names.

Indicate all affiliations with a lowercase superscript letter immediately after the author's name and in front of the appropriate address. Provide the full postal address of each affiliation, including the country name and, if available, the e-mail address of each author.

#### **Corresponding Author**

Clearly indicate who will handle correspondence at all stages of refereeing and publication, also postpublication. Ensure that the e-mail address is given and that contact details are kept up to date by the corresponding author.

#### Highlights

Highlights are mandatory and will be used in the article as well as in APN E-lib metadata portal for indexing. They consist of a short collection of bullet points that convey the core findings of the article and should be included in your manuscript. Please avoid reproducing text from the abstract, but instead, include 3 to 5 bullet points (maximum 85 characters, including spaces, per bullet point).

#### Abstract

A concise and factual abstract that states briefly the purpose of the activity, the main results and conclusions. The abstract must not exceed 200 words.

#### Keywords

Provide a maximum of 6 keywords. Be sparing with abbreviations in keywords unless they are firmly established in your field of study.

#### Main Body

- 1. **Introduction**: State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background. Avoid repeating the abstract or providing a detailed literature review or a summary of the results.
- 2. **Methodology**: Provide sufficient detail to allow the work, whether research- or capacity-based, to be reproduced (methods already published should be referenced; only relevant modifications should be described).
- 3. **Results and Discussion**: Results should be clear and concise. Discussion should explore the significance of the results of the work, not repeat them. Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature.
- 4. **Conclusion**: The main conclusions including outputs of the work should be presented in this section.
- 5. **Acknowledgements**: Collate acknowledgements at the end of the article before the references and do not include them on the title page.

#### References

We recommend using a reference management tool to manage your citations.

#### **Reference** Style

Please use APA 6th Edition format for references and in-text citations (refer to <u>APA format and style</u> <u>guide</u> on Purdue Online Writing Lab)

#### In-text Citation

Please ensure that every reference cited in the text is also present in the reference list and vice versa. Any references cited in the abstract must be given in full.

#### Language

Please prepare your text in British English (Oxford spelling).

#### Editing

All manuscripts must be edited by a professional English language editing service or a native English speaker familiar with your field of study before they are submitted to APN.

#### **Other Formatting Requirements**

#### Illustrations

All illustrations created in MS Office applications should be submitted in their original formats (DOCX, XLSX or PPTX). Other acceptable formats include AI, EPS, JPEG, PNG, PSD, TIFF, etc. For optimal press quality, ensure that all illustrations are large enough to accommodate printing at 300 dpi (dots per inch) resolution. Avoid supplying graphic files in GIF, BMP, PICT or WPG formats.

#### Abbreviations

Abbreviations must be defined at their first mention. Ensure consistency of abbreviations throughout the article.

#### Nomenclature and units

Follow internationally accepted rules and conventions: use the international system of units (SI).

#### Footnotes

Footnotes should be used sparingly. Number them consecutively throughout the article, using Arabic numbers in superscript. Do not include footnotes in the Reference list.

#### Figure and Tables

Figures and Tables must be numbered and captioned. When using tables, ensure that the data presented in them do not duplicate results described elsewhere in the article.

#### Copyright

APN applies the Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial 4.0 International (CC BY-NC 4.0) license to works it publishes in the APN Science Bulletin. This license was developed to facilitate open access, and under this license, authors agree to make articles available for reuse, without permission or fees, for any non-commercial purposes provided that the user gives appropriate credit, provides a link to the license, and indicates if changes were made.

### SUBMISSION CHECKLIST

The following list will be useful during the final checking of an article before sending it to the APN for review. Please ensure that the following items are present before submitting your manuscript:

The manuscript has been edited by a professional English language editing service or a native English speaker familiar with your field of study.
The list of authors is complete, with given name(s) and family name (s) clearly indicated.
The affiliation and postal addresses of all authors are provided.
The corresponding author is clearly indicated and their email address provided.
All illustrations and tables are numbered and captioned, and attached as separate files.
All in-text citations are listed the References section, and vice versa.
All references and in-text citations are prepared in APA 6th Edition style.
Permissions for using any material (copyrighted or otherwise) from other sources have been granted.
