existing networks for impacts, vulnerability and adaptation and encouraged the establishment of new networks."


#### **Establishment:**

was launched in Bangkok as part of the Global Adaptation Network in October 2009

#### Aim:

Building climate resilience of vulnerable human systems, ecosystems and economies through the mobilisation and sharing of knowledge and technologies to support adaptation capacity building, policy-setting, planning and practices.

#### APAN Specific Goals and Objectives



- Regenerate and share knowledge and information on adaptation to enhance adaptive actions;

- develop the capacity of national and local governments and institutions

#### Structure of APAN

- The Regional Hub is co-hosted by the Institute for Global Environmental Strategies (IGES) and the Asian Institute of Technology/ Regional Resource Center for Asia-Pacific (RRC.AP);
- The Sub-Regional Nodes (SRNs) and the Thematic Nodes (TNs) of APAN work in partnership with the national partners to implement activities in coordination with Regional Hub.



### **APAN Activities**



## Asia-Pacific Climate Change Adaptation Forum 2011


