


The Asia-Pacific Network for Global Change Research (APN) is a network of member governments in the Asia-Pacific whose vision is to enable countries in the region to successfully address global change challenges through science-based response strategies and measures, effective science and policy linkages, and scientific capacity development.

Highlights of 2009/2010

- Annual Regional Call for Research Proposals Programme (ARCP): supported/managed 19 projects
- Scientific Capacity Building/Enhancement for Sustainable Development in Developing Countries Programme (CAPaBLE): supported/managed 14 projects
- Special Call for Proposals for a Focussed Activity: Scientific Capacity Building for Climate Impact and Vulnerability Assessments (SCBCIA); received 82 proposals and managing 7 projects
- 2009 APN Annual Proposal Calls and Review Process under ARCP & CAPaBLE Programmes
- Two-year synthesis activity Climate in Asia and the Pacific: synthesising the work of over 50 APN climate projects



- APN-funded projects overall had very good success in meeting the 5 goals of the APN 2nd Strategic Phase (outstanding projects were selected)
- APN has steadily improved and expanded its interactions with policy- and decision-makers, thus helping to provide sound scientific basis for policy- and decision-making related to global change in the region
- Bhutan was endorsed as a new member at the 15th Inter-Governmental Meeting (IGM)/Scientific Planning Group (SPG) Meeting, bringing the number of APN member countries to 22
- Launched a new APN website as the APN entered its third strategic phase, from April 2010
- Devised Resources Development Strategy that was endorsed at the 15th IGM/ SPG Meeting
- Two Programme Fellows joined the APN Secretariat (in autumn) as part of APN's capacity development programme
- Contributing to policy processes and bodies such as the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI), Subsidiary Body for Scientific Technological Advice (SBSTA) and the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) through research and capacity development activities, particularly in developing countries
- Addressing the needs identified by United Nations Commission for Sustainable Development (UNCSD) in ensuring that activities and outputs fully address issues of sustainable development for the region
- Communicating and collaborating closely with key organisations in the global change community to achieve shared goals, maximise available resources, and deliver the best possible results
