



## SIDS and the Samoa Pathway

- Small island developing states (SIDS): Face unique set of issues relating to their small size, remoteness, narrow resource and export base and exposure to external economic and environmental shocks
- The SAMOA Pathway an int'l framework that articulates the aspirations of SIDS, recognizing that genuine and durable partnerships play a crucial role

SDGs = wellbeing




## Wellbeing Dimensions in the Pacific

SDGs are interlinked; achieving one goal benefits the other(s)





>> A successful and effective partnership fosters stakeholder participation




## Problem statement

- 2. What are the main considerations in sustaining cooperation/partnerships among stakeholders?




## Partnership model, example by APN
