# Speaker's Profile

#### SAITO Motohiko, Governor of Hyogo Prefecture

Born in Kobe City, Hyogo Prefecture in 1977. After graduating from the University of Tokyo, he joined the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications. In addition to his work within the ministry, he has experienced working at various local governments, such as Sado City in Niigata Prefecture, litate Village in Fukushima Prefecture, Miyagi Prefecture, and Osaka Prefecture. In August 2021, he became the 53rd Governor of Hyogo Prefecture.



#### TAKEUCHI Kazuhiko, President of IGES

Project Professor of the Institute for Future Initiatives at the University of Tokyo. He has also served as Acting Chair of the Central Environment Council of Japan's Ministry of the Environment and a Visiting Professor at United Nations University Institute for the Advanced Study of Sustainability. He has received various awards, including the Ichimura Prize in Science against Global Warming for Distinguished Achievement, and the MIDORI Academic Prize. He specialises in sustainability science.





### WATANABE Ryugo, Mayor of Sado City

He served as an employee of Sado City until 2019. In 2008, he established the certification system for the rice of Sado "Toki to Kurasu Sato" (Living in harmony with Japanese Crested Ibis). In 2011, he helped Sado City become one of the first sites in Japan to be recognised as a World Agricultural Heritage Site. He has also served as Director of the Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries Division, General Affairs Division, and General Policy Division. He has been in his current position since 2020.



Research Fellow in the Biodiversity and Society Programme of UNU-IAS. Has long experience of working in the science-policy-practice interface of Biodiversity and human well-being, focusing on issues of equity, integration of knowledge systems, socio-ecological resilience and related topics. She has actively contributed to several global assessments related to biodiversity and facilitated policy discussions in multilateral forums such as the Convention on Biological diversity.
